


#### A Message from Mayor Noel B. Cummings . . .



#### **UPDATES FROM HODGKINS POLICE DEPARTMENT**



#### HODGKINS POLICE DEPT. WELCOMES NEW OFFICER

On March 28th, 2019, lifelong Hodgkins resident Allan Mills, Jr. was sworn in as the newest member of the Hodgkins Police Department. Flanked by Mayor Cummings, Police Chief Ernest Millsap, and Trustee Lida Mills, Village Clerk Stephanie Gardner administered the oath as many gathered friends, family, police department members, and village onlookers watched nearby.

From there, Allan immediately began a twelve-week stint at the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy at the College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, where he passed all courses with high marks, graduating on July 3rd. Since then, he's been in the Field Training Program at Hodgkins PD and is set to begin full patrol duties in September. Be sure to say to hello to Officer Mills when you see him around town!

#### HODGKINS POLICE OFFICER TO BE DEPLOYED OVERSEAS



Hodgkins Police Department member Desmond Handson worked his last day on July 24th, before shipping out overseas to serve his country in the US Army Reserve on a lengthy deployment. On that day, Chief Millsap and the members of the Hodgkins PD, as well as others from the village, and members of Desmond's family, celebrated his service in a send-off that included food, photos, and warm

wishes from the community. Earlier, on Sunday, past and current members of the department gathered at Buck's Pit Stop to do much the same. Some of them ended their celebrations of Desmond's service gathered under a street light pole with a sign commemorating the Army Reserve Lieutenant's deployment, for a small group photo with Desmond and his wife. Please keep Officer Handson in your thoughts and prayers as he goes to serve our country!

#### **Public Works Department**

As a service to our residents we offer pick up of large items the garbage company doesn't take, such as furniture. Our NEW policy will be to have any soiled mattress and or box spring covered in plastic when the Village picks it up. Any sofa, cushion or chair that is soiled must also be wrapped in plastic. The Village cannot go into your home or on your deck to pick up your items for insurance reasons. Items must be placed in driveway or curb.

Yard waste is to be put in paper bags. The weight limit is not to exceed 40lbs. Brush should be put on the curb, cut side out.

We do not accept any materials such as: hazardous waste, paint, batteries, tires, etc.

Please ask for a Village truck for spring cleaning projects. Trucks aren't always available due to prior bookings and Village needs. Please call ahead to request a truck 708-579-6700.

#### MAKING EMERGENCY CALLS FROM CELL PHONES

While we always encourage you to use 9-1-1 when making emergency calls, you may also reach the OLREC dispatch center (for Hodgkins) by calling them directly at 708-352-4476.

According to IL911INFO.ORG, when 9-1-1 is dialed from a landline phone from a home or business, the caller's location and phone number is delivered to that location's **PSAP**, (**P**ublic **S**afety **A**nswering **P**oint). This permits the 9-1-1 call taker to dispatch fire, police or emergency medical services (EMS) to the caller's location, even if the caller is unable to communicate with the 9-1-1 call taker.

**Making 9-1-1 calls from a cell phone is different, however**, from making a call from a landline. When a wireless 9-1-1 call is made from a cell phone, the call is transmitted to the nearest cell tower, which then routes that call via landline to the PSAP which is designated to receive 9-1-1 calls from the caller's area.

It's important for the wireless caller to know the area they're in when making a cell phone call to 9-1-1. The PSAP (dispatch center) that answers their call may not be the PSAP that services the area the wireless caller is calling from. Knowing the location is vital to getting the appropriate police, fire, or EMS units to respond. Issues might arise when the nearest cell phone tower is located in a different fire, police, or EMS jurisdiction from the one where the wireless caller is calling from. Such a call would then have to be transferred to the correct dispatch center. It is essential that the caller can communicate their location in order to be quickly transferred to the correct PSAP that serves the area where the emergency is happening.

#### IL911INFO.ORG gives the following helpful hints:

- Do not become irritated if your call is transferred to another PSAP and you are requested to repeat information you may have already given to the previous 9-1-1 call taker.
- Give an exact street number and street name if possible, or the closest intersections.
- Know the location of the incident. Providing an accurate address is critically important when making a wireless 9-1-1 call.
- It is helpful to know your cell phone number, to give to the call taker.
- Provide a business name or landmark if the address is not known.
- It is important to remain calm while on the phone so that the call taker can understand you.

The Hodgkins Police Department receives emergency communications from dispatchers outside of town, due to a recent state mandate to consolidate dispatch centers. Since May of 2017, Hodgkins Police dispatch services have been provided by the Oak Lawn Regional Emergency Communication Center (OLREC), located in the Village of Oak Lawn. OLREC also handles police and fire dispatch for Oak Lawn, Burbank, Bridgeview, Evergreen Park, and Alsip, and fire dispatch for Bedford Park, Lyons, and the Central Stickney Fire Protection District, providing coverage for over 143,000 residents. This dispatch center is located on the second floor of the Oak Lawn Village Hall, and has nine dispatch positions, in addition to supervisory and IT support staff. Again, you may reach them directly at 708-352-4623, although we still encourage you to use 9-1-1 for emergencies. Thank you, and stay safe!



Elaine was born and raised in Hodgkins. She is the daughter of Leo and Phyllis Kovel. Her siblings Leo Jr., Ann and Steve all attended Hodgkins

Elementary School, Gurrie Junior High School and Lyons Township High School. After graduation Elaine became a licensed Cosmetologist. Elaine married Dale Thompson in 1979 and have 2 children Bridget and Brandon. They enjoy two grandchildren, Mara and Pearl.

She was always community minded and involved. She served on the Hodgkins Park District Board as President and Vice President, was the President of the Hodgkins PTO.

In 1994, she began working in the Hodgkins Village Hall as a part time clerk. In 1995 an opening became available in the Police Department for a full time clerk position. Elaine accepted the position and the rest, as we say, is history.

Elaine hit the ground running and never looked back. Organizing the records department wasn't an easy task. At the time, our Youth Division had been

running a annual Bike-Alude Children's Thon to Benefit St. Jude



Children's Research Hospital. In 2015, the Police Department held the last St Jude Bike-A-Thon and over 24 Years had raised over \$100,000 for St. Jude.

Elaine always volunteered to help even before she worked at the police department. In 1995, the Youth Division sponsored a "Anti-Gang Day" at the Hodgkins Elementary School. In 1998, Elaine proposed to combine the Annual Anti Gang Day with a Police Safety Day.

In the year 1999, there was growing concern about the upcoming New Year, 2000.

Many computer experts worldwide were uncertain as to what would happen when computer changed to the year 2000 at midnight around the world. Predictions of power grid failures, telephone and satellite failures, widespread computer crash's and anything that is ran





by computers could potentially fail. While most people were home or at

organized parties to celebrate the new Millennium (something that most of us will only experience once in a lifetime) our First Responders, Police and Fire were on the job to stand ready for any emergencies that may happen. Elaine spent the New Millennium at her desk in the Hodgkins Police Department.

In addition to police records, then Chief Hugh Rhodes sent Elaine and Ofc. Hansel Howard to the National Transportation Board to become certified in the inspection and use of Child Car Seats. This allowed the Hodgkins Police Department to host Child Car Seat inspections and proper installation for our area residents. Elaine was a member of the South Suburban Car Seat Safety Coalition and received an award for her dedication in 2000.

In 2001, the Village completed the construction on the new Police Department located on Lenzi Avenue. The move was an enormous task and Elaine spent months preparing and organizing the move, at the same time performing her daily job duties.

Following the Terror Attacks on September 11, 2001, the police

department began to focus on supporting our troops. At the time, Chief Hugh Rhodes began planning for gathering support and sending supplies to our troops overseas. Elaine planned all the logistics. She planned business meetings to gain support to raise funds to purchase supplies. Then, she organized packing parties at the police station to pack supplies and get the boxes delivered to the post office for our troops serving. We would pack up to 70





large boxes of assorted supplies at each event. Our local business and residential response was huge and greatly appreciated. In 2011, the Police Department and Hodgkins

Fraternal Order of Police sponsored a "Support Our Troops" fundraiser at the LaGrange American Legion Post and, you guessed it, Elaine put it all together.

Elaine was a member of the Illinois Law Enforcement Administrative Professionals.

The Statewide organization is comprised of Administrative professionals in Police Agencies. Elaine served the organization as Secretary, Vice President and as President. She received the LEAP Community Leader Award in 2012.

Elaine landed on the Hodgkins Police Department in 1995 and never looked back. For the next 24 years she would help keep the department organized and up to date. Logistics are hardly ever talked about in police departments. The public usually only deals with officers on the street. If Elaine encountered an issue that she didn't have an answer for, she would research it and find the solution.

We could not possibly list a 11 of E 1 a i ne's accomplishments and events that she ran and/or participated in. To say that she raised the bar and set a very high standard for those who follow her in the position, would be an understatement.

Elaine, congratulations on your well deserved retirement. Your dedication and professionalism for the Village and Police Department is greatly appreciated.

#### Avoid a Ticket & Be Courteous To Your Neighbors

All Dogs in the Village of Hogkins MUST be registered at the Village of Hodgkins Hall.

This is a free, yearly license for Village residents. You will need a certificate from your vet showing that your dogs rabies shot is up to date. The Village will issue you a dog license and a tag to be placed on the dogs collar. Any dog caught without a tag is subject to a misdemeanor. The license tag or receipt shall be shown to a police officer or to the health officer upon demand. This is for your dogs safety as well as Village residents.

All Dogs must be on a leash at all times when on any public street, sidewalk, parkway or public area within the Village. Any dog caught without a leash is subject to a misdemeanor.

Any owner, keeper or person walking a dog, or permitting a dog to stray, shall be liable to clean up dog feces caused by his dog outside of his own property. Any person walking outside of his own property shall carry a litter bag and scoop, pick up his dog feces and placed in a plastic bag and dispose of it in a proper container. This is also a misdemeanor ticket.

A copy of our Village ordinance regarding animal control is available upon request at the Village Hall. Animal Control 6-3-1: through 6-3-11:



Are you feeling the Quarry Blast? The Village has endured these quarry blasts for decades. We are located next to the Vulcan Materials Quarry and during Spring, Summer and Fall the quarry will use blasting to help in their mining.

Most of the time, Vulcan Materials will blast around 12:00 - 12:15 in the afternoon. Sometimes it will be later in the afternoon. Depending on weather conditions, the blast may be delayed or even postponed.

The severity of these blasts can be effected by certain weather and wind conditions. Sometimes, it may feel that you are in the middle of a short Earthquake and other times you might just feel a small vibration.

If you feel these blasts are too severe, then you should contact the Hodgkins Village Hall at 579-6700 and express your complaints when the blasts occur. You can also make a complaint with Vulcan Materials on their Local Quarry Complaint Line:
