\$ Village Tax and Garbage Rebates \$

At the Board meeting on August 14, The Village Board has voted to continue rebates this year.

The Residential Tax Rebates are paid to those residents who received property tax bills from Cook County. Proof of payment is required. This is obtained by a receipt from your bank or lender. The Village will reimburse you, The Village of Hodgkins portion listed on your tax bill.

Mobile Home residents and those residents that rent or lease an apartment are eligible for a garbage rebate as long as you have resided in Hodgkins as of January 1st, 2023 and still reside here. You will need a valid photo ID with the correct address. These rebates will be available starting Nov. 15, 2023—Dec. 15, 2023. Email phishing

The most common form of phishing, this type of attack uses tactics like phony hyperlinks to lure email recipients into sharing their personal information. Attackers often masquerade as a large account provider like UPS, Amazon or Google, or even a coworker.

Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. You might get an unexpected email or text message that looks like it's from a company you know or trust, like a bank or a credit card or utility company. Or maybe it's from an online payment website or app. The message could be from a scammer, who might

- or app. The message could be from a scammer, who might
- say they've noticed some suspicious activity or log-in attempts they haven't
- claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information there isn't
- say you need to confirm some personal or financial information you don't
- include an invoice you don't recognize it's fake
- want you to click on a link to make a payment but the link has malware
- say you're eligible to register for a government refund it's a scam
- offer a coupon for free stuff it's not real
- The email says your account is on hold because of a billing problem.
- The email invites you to click on a link to update your payment details.

Four Ways To Protect Yourself From Phishing

1. Protect your computer by using security software.

Set the <u>software to update automatically</u> so it will deal with any new security threats.

2. Protect your cell phone by setting software to update automatically.

These updates could give you critical protection against security threats.

3. Protect your accounts by using multi-factor authentication. Some accounts offer extra security by requiring two or more credentials to log in to your account. This is called multi-factor authentication. The extra credentials you need to log in to your account fall into three categories:

- something you know like a passcode, a PIN, or the answer to a security question.
- \cdot something you have like a one-time verification passcode you get by text, email, or from an authenticator app; or a security key
- **something you are** like a scan of your fingerprint, your retina, or your face Multi-factor authentication makes it harder for scammers to log in to your accounts if they do get your username and password.

4. Protect your data by backing it up. <u>Back up the data on your computer</u> to an external hard drive or in the cloud. Back up the data on your phone, too.


What To Do if You Responded to a Phishing Email

If you think a scammer has your information, like your Social Security, credit card, or bank account number, go to <u>IdentityTheft.gov</u>. There you'll see the specific steps to take based on the information that you lost.

If you think you clicked on a link or opened an attachment that downloaded harmful software, <u>update your</u> <u>computer's security software</u>. Then run a scan and remove anything it identifies as a problem.

How To Report Phishing

If you got a phishing **email**, forward it to the Anti-Phishing Working Group at <u>reportphishing@apwg.org</u>. If you got a phishing <u>text message</u>, forward it to SPAM (7726).

OFFICER PARKS JOINS THE FORCE

You may have noticed a new face on the streets of Hodgkins lately, perhaps out walking around the shopping center or making the rounds in a patrol vehicle. That's because the Hodgkins Police Department has made a recent addition, in the person of Officer Seth Parks.

Officer Parks comes to us from Indiana, where he has a background in law enforcement. Growing up in Anderson, Indiana (just outside of

Indianapolis), he encountered a tough situation as a youth that galvanized his desire to get into law enforcement. When I sat down with him recently to interview him for the Communicator, he had this to say about it:

"I had a rough childhood. A police officer made a real difference for me in my teens, and I've never forgotten that. I decided that, if he could help change my life for the better, then maybe I could do the same for others."

Starting at age 21, Seth worked in corrections for seven years, starting at Madison County and continuing in Delaware County, Indiana. He later moved to Indianapolis, where he entered law enforcement at Indianapolis University Health, remaining there for three years until he saw an opportunity to come work for Hodgkins Police Department.

"I'm been involved with the sport of bodybuilding for ten years, and it was through those connections that I met Officer Rocco Giannelli and learned about an upcoming patrol officer list."

After successfully completing our testing and hiring process, Officer Parks was sworn in as our newest police officer. He then headed to Champaign for sixteen weeks of academy training at the Police Training Institute, starting in early May. He graduated from that course in August, and now he's going through our Hodgkins PD Field Training program.

CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The Hodgkins Police Department and Countryside Police Department will be jointly conducting a Citizens Police Academy soon. This will be a 6-week course designed to equip interested members of the community with information about how police operations are carried out. This is a free course, starting November 2nd, 2023, and held on Thursday evenings from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm. Three classes will be held at the Countryside Police Department, and three classes will be held at the Hodgkins Police Department. Topics covered will include:

Patrol Operations ♦ Investigations Operations ♦ Criminal & Traffic Law Use of Force ♦ SWAT & Firearms ♦ Specialties ♦ Scenarios

Participants must be at least eighteen years of age, must live, work, or volunteer in Hodgkins or Countryside, and must submit an application. The Village of Hodgkins is now enforcing Ordinance No. 22-01

The following procedures shall be followed from November 1st through April when snowfall of 2" or more shall occur:

On odd numbered days there shall be parking only on sides of the street with odd numbers. Example -If 2" or more snowfall occurs on January 1st, all vehicles must be parked on the sides of street with odd numbers or in the owner's driveway.

On even numbered days there shall be parking only on sides of the street with even numbers. Example - If 2" or more snowfall occurs on January 2nd, all vehicles must be parked on the sides of street with even numbers or in the owner's driveway.

Residents parking on Cobb and Lyons Streets: on even numbered days there shall be parking only on the south side of the street. On odd numbered days there shall be parking only on the north side of the street.

Please Remember to ... **Keep Your Cars Off the Sidewalks**

For Snow Removal. When we get snow, the Public Works can not go around cars that are partially parked on the sidewalk. It is very important to keep our sidewalks clean so no one gets hurt!
