ORDINANCE NO. 21 – 02

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE, MAKE AND APPROPRIATE

FOR GENERAL CORPORATE AND OTHER SPECIAL PURPOSES FOR THE

YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2021, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021,

FOR THE VILLAGE OF HODGKINS, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hodgkins, Cook County, Illinois:

SECTION 1
