This just don't make sense. 8 9 MR. O'CONNELL: We have submitted an appraisal. I 10 don't know if you have a copy. 11 Your last name is Magnus? 12 MR. MAGNUSSON: Magnusson. 13 MR. O'CONNELL: Did you get a copy of the 14 appraisal that we submitted? 15 MR. MAGNUSSON: No. 16 MR. O'CONNELL: Here is an extra copy. 17 MR. MAGNUSSON: Is this based on the sales? MR. O'CONNELL: I am submitting to you, 18 19 Mr. Magnusson, we did that. It's November, 2013, so it's not long ago. It's a recent appraisal. 20 21 MR. MAGNUSSON: Okay. 22 MR. O'CONNELL: We submitted our prices, our 23 properties, our comparable properties, vacant properties. We welcome your counter to that. 24

And I think it's fair to say, we don't want to just say, "no," just to say "no." We are offering you what we think is a fair market value. We will be entitled -- you will be entitled to say what you think is a fair market value.

MR. MAGNUSSON: Right.

And you have your appraiser. We have our comps, and you have your comps. They should be the same, because the properties adjoining.

MR. O'CONNELL: Well, that's why we welcome your comps.

MR. CUMMINGS: We want to give you a fair price for your property, but we have to follow whatever the people who appraise the property, that's what we have to use. We can't appraise it ourselves.
