


A Message from Mayor Ernest Millsap . . .

Hodgkins School Finishes Last Phase of Beautification

Hodgkins School started to update the landscaping in the fall of 2019. The plan consisted of 5 phases. Because of Covid though, these projects took longer than expected.

- Phase 1. A new brick sidewalk was laid in the front of the school. Elias Lopez volunteered his time to install the sidewalk for the school. After the sidewalk was completed, a group of volunteers helped plant new bushes, perennials, and spread mulch, one rainy Saturday morning. After lots of hard work, Phase 1 was completed by the end of November.
- Phase 2 was the installation of a tree bench, new bushes under the cafeteria windows with river rock. Lumie Jones and Jimmy Carson designed and built the tree bench. It really adds character to the south side of the building! This project was finished in the fall of 2021.



- Phase 3 was the front of the building again, the original building. A bench to honor the retirement (June of 2020) of longtime resource teacher Leesa Mchugh, was installed. The Millsap family also bought a lilac tree and purple bushes to be planted, in memory of their mother, Alida Millsap. This area was finished in the fall of 2020. Each spring annuals have been planted to give the area color.
- Phase 4 was the back of the building, along Conrad Ave. This area was started in the fall of 2021 and we just finished last fall, 2022. Old bushes were removed and new ones planted along with mulching and new perennials.
- Phase 5 was the north side of the building. Old bushes were removed and new ones planted. This project was also just finished last fall, 2022.



All this work was made possible through sponsorships. Some of the businesses in Hodgkins that generously donated funds were; The Village of Hodgkins, Republic Bank, Leesa & Mark McHugh, Advantage Chevrolet, Walmart, Sam's Club, UPS, and Hodgkins School PTO.

A very special thank you needs to go out to longtime resident, Elias Lopez. Elias donated not only his time but also his expertise in landscaping. Elias was involved in every project. Without his hard work and dedication to the project, none of this would have been possible. Thank you Mr. Lopez!

Thank you to all the volunteers who have donated their time to each of our phases. Sometimes there would be 8 volunteers, other times just 1 or 2. But each time, everyone always gave it their all! This past fall, Sam's Club volunteered their time when team members came to help pull weeds and do new planting.

Fresh flowers will be planted each spring and fall. Look for more changes coming this spring to the front of the building. SERGEANT MILLER RETIRES

A longstanding fixture of the Hodgkins Police Department has moved on to the next phase of his life. Sergeant Todd Miller, after serving our community for twenty-five years (since June of 1997), has entered a well-deserved retirement.

Sgt. Miller first came to Hodgkins from Justice Police Department. After an initial stint in patrol, he became an investigator for a number of years, assisting the department in the prosecution of many important cases. He worked under the supervision of Lt. Mark Wilkans during this time.

Later, when Todd was promoted to sergeant, he returned for many years to the street as a patrol supervisor. He worked many long, tireless hours, and at all hours of the day and night, patrolling the community to help keep it safe and overseeing other officers in the performance of their duties. When circumstances allowed, he returned eventually to investigations as a detective sergeant, where he continued working on important ongoing cases. He was in charge of organizing and maintaining the Knox Box program for emergency services entrance into homes and businesses. He also played an important part in the Aging Well program by continually educating and informing our senior citizens about an array of current and ongoing concerns, such as personal safety and security practices.

On December 8th, Sgt. Miller's last work shift, he was joined by new and old friends and



colleagues for food and an official send-off. Oak Lawn dispatch read out a fitting tribute to him from Hodgkins PD management over the airwaves during his final 10-42:

Thank you, Sgt. Todd Miller, for your 31 years of dedicated service to law enforcement and to the people of the Village of Hodgkins. Your service as a training instructor, a shift supervisor, and an investigator has been an especially important part of our operations. Thank you for working to honorably protect life and property in our community and for serving the members of our community with professionalism and dedication. Best wishes to you and your family as you begin a well-earned retirement and enter the next chapter of your life.

Next, Todd plans to work as head of security in a west suburbs school district. We know his great knowledge and experience will help him to be a success in this as well. But he says he will be back from time to time to check on us and maybe have a burger at Buck's Pit Stop. Be sure to congratulate him whenever you see him in town!

The Board of Trustees of the Hodgkins Public Library District has authorized an ordinance for a referendum seeking \$5.5 million dollars to construct a state-of-the-art building to last well beyond the next 40 years. We are seeking your support at the Consolidated Election on April 4, 2023 to construct a modern 10,500 square foot building that the residents of Hodgkins will be proud of. This new building will be energy efficient, ADA compatible, and compliant of all modern building code. Below is the question as it will appear on the ballot:

Hodgkins Public Library District- Proposition to Issue Bonds

Shall the bonds of Hodgkins Public Library District, Cook County, Illinois, in the amount of \$5,500,000.00 be issued for the purpose of erecting and furnishing necessary equipment for a new library building?

How did the Board come to the conclusion that the library needs a new building? It all started with a modernization plan to address significant deficiencies in the building and on the property. The building is having some issues to be expected in a 40 year old public structure, and the parking lot is starting to show significant wear. So, in 2019 the Library Board began to explore an opportunity to update the facility, and hired an architect to look at what could be done. Concerns about the pandemic put those plans on hold until Fall 2021. The decision was made to press forward and explore a renovation and modest expansion of the library. Spring of 2022 brought space analysis studies, and early Fall of 2022 was the discovery study on the building infrastructure.

During this study, engineers discovered three significant problems: (1) The primary problem, due to construction shortcuts and the long-term failure of the exterior cladding, is significant rust to our steel frame. (2) An inadequate vapor barrier has allowed moisture to constantly seep behind the cladding for most of the last 42 years. Without solving this issue, the structure will continue to weaken and eventually fail. (3) All of our insulation is water damaged, as well as the first layer of our drywall. Fortunately, we have been able to prevent mold growth because enough air has been able to sneak past the cladding.

The Library Board was given an estimate to fix the three primary issues with the building plus bringing the structure into modern building code, and the cost is essentially more than it would be to build a new structure.

Based on financial projections from our financial partner, we estimate the cost of the project to be:

\$27.83 per \$50,000 Assessed Value

\$55.65 per \$100,000 Assessed Value

The Library District will be looking to borrow these funds for 20 years

While difficult to hear, asking for the funds for a new building is the most financially responsible thing to do.

The Board of Trustees will be hosting a public hearing regarding this referendum on Monday, March 6 from 7:00 - 9:00 pm in the meeting room of the Library. We will also be continually updating our website with information as it becomes available. Additionally, please do not hesitate to reach out with any questions via email, phone call, or coming into the library.



The Village of Hodgkins is now enforcing Ordinance No. 22-01

The following procedures shall be followed from November 1st through April when snowfall of 2" or more shall occur:

On odd numbered days there shall be parking only on sides of the street with odd numbers. *Example* - If 2" or more snowfall occurs on January 1st, all vehicles must be parked on the sides of street with odd numbers or in the owner's driveway.

On even numbered days there shall be parking only on sides of the street with even numbers. *Example* - If 2" or more snowfall occurs on January 2nd, all vehicles must be parked on the sides of street with even numbers or in the owner's driveway.

Residents parking on Cobb and Lyons Streets: on even numbered days there shall be parking only on the south side of the street. On odd numbered days there shall be parking only on the north side of the street.
