A Message from Mayor Ernest Millsap . . .

It has been three years since the Village and the City of Countryside entered into an intergovernmental agreement with a developer who wanted to open a restaurant on the old Eddie Z's property on 75th Street and the southbound I-294 exit. After the Covid Pandemic, a sluggish economy and the sale to a new owner, we are finally on the verge of seeing Duckee's Travel Center become a reality. Permits have been issued and we are now awaiting renovations to begin on the building. The building is in Hodgkins but the Truck fueling is to be on property in Countryside. The developer incentives and revenue will be shared equally between the two communi-

ties. This kind of cooperative development is unique and we are anxious to make both towns better with this Project.

The owner's goal is to make Duckee's the Midwest's premier travel stop. It will feature a 24/7 quality quick food and fuel facility.

The fueling component of *Duckee's* commercial enterprise will feature five under canopy truck bays, 16 pumps under canopy, and nine tier 3 EV charging stations. The existing 22,000 square foot building on the property is being repurposed to provide a well-stocked convenience store, gaming, and standard truck stop amenities including showers, laundry, and a trucker's lounge. *Duckee's* is committed to providing unparalleled cleanliness and safety in their restrooms, with 17 individual private, lockable full-service bathrooms.


Duckee's offers a wide variety of dining options and has set out to change the way people view gas station food. Whether you're enjoying an organic egg croissant sandwich for breakfast, a ¹/₄ lb. hot dog topped with pork belly for lunch, or a juicy steak for dinner, *Duckee's* is focused on providing fresh, high-quality ingredients, with recipes made in-house. Everything on the menu will be made to order and can be eaten on property, picked up or delivered. Food amenities will include a specialty coffee operation, bubble tea, Fredee's Famous Beef, Kernel's Gourmet Popcorn, and Lindt Chocolate and Ice Cream.

Customers will have the option to dine in the family friendly dining room which holds 50 people or preorder and pick up their food from the cashless, multi-lane drive-thru facility. Programing includes a three-lane drive-thru driveway with access to a center escape lane to optimize customer wait time and enhance employee safety mainly for a happier drive-thru experience.

We will make sure our residents know when ground will be broken on this Project.

We have accepted the low bid for the new Paul G. Struve Public Works Facility Offices. The project will be approved and awarded at the March Board meeting and will begin this spring.


Andrew and Samantha, as well as great grandchildren. Leon would become involved in the Village in various positions, on the Volunteer Fire

Our committee is already planning for this year's event.



Nicholas Dwyer Becomes HPD's Newest Face on the Street

You may have seen a new, fresh face patrolling the streets of Hodgkins in the past couple of months. That would be Nicholas Dwyer, the Hodgkins Police Department's newest patrol officer.

Sworn in back in September, Dwyer was sent to the Police Training Institute at the University of Illinois in Champaign for a sixteen-week, thorough po-

lice officer training regimen. After graduating that program on December 21st, he came to Hodgkins and began working the streets under his Field Training Officer on December 26th.

Dwyer grew up in Oak Forest, Illinois, the son of an Evergreen Park police officer (his dad retired in 2016 after a 27 and a half year career). In a recent interview, Dwyer stated that he'd always been interested in becoming a police officer, from a young age.

"It was that or military. Both my grandfathers had been in the military. I wanted to play football in college, so when I started doing that, I decided to go ahead and go the police career route."

Dwyer studied criminal justice at St. Xavier University in Chicago.

When asked if he had anything else he'd like to say to the people of the community, he added, "I'm really looking forward to a long career with the Village of Hodgkins.
